Crisis Intervention Team Follow Up	<ul> <li>Discussed process for Silver Alert. Silver Alerts can only be issued by law enforcement, based on the following criteria: the missing person is age 60+, has Alzheimer's/dementia/other cognitive impairment which poses a threat to their health and safety, reasonable belief that the disappearance is due to their impaired cognitive condition, the request is within 72 hours to disappearance, and sufficient information available to disseminate to the public that could assist in locating the missing person.</li> <li>Lindsay shared Morrow Home's process for missing residents (code yellow).</li> <li>Julie reviewed the priorities for the 2019-2023 Dementia-Capable Wisconsin Plan (https://www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/publications/p02137.pdf). One of the priority areas is crisis response, with the following goals:         <ul> <li>Increase dementia-related knowledge and competency of crisis response professionals.</li> <li>Develop a uniform system of dementia-related crisis response with priority on treating and managing crisis in place.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Brief discussion on post-crisis resources         <ul> <li>ADRC's role in a crisis response would be follow-up after so that another doesn't happen again. Respite care, environmental changes, supportive services, looking at alternative living environment.</li> <li>Discussed a referral protocol-List of options, post crisis (talk with ADRC, sign up for project lifesaver, other organizations that provide caregiving support).</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	Will have further discussion after speakers at next meeting  Will look to see if other counties have dementia-crisis models to help guide our efforts
